SPECIAL CHARACTER October: Month of the Holy Rosary

On October 7th, the Church celebrates the feast day of Mary, Queen of the Holy Rosary. The feast day was established by Pope Saint Pius V on the anniversary of the



victory at Lepanto on October 7, 1571. The naval victory was attributed to the Virgin Mary whose intercession was entreated through the recitation of the Holy Rosary. The Church then proceeded to dedicate the entire month of October to the Holy Rosary so that individuals, families, and communities would pray the Holy Rosary, if possible, on a daily basis for peace in the world. The whole Rosary is composed of twenty decades. Each decade is recited in honour of a mystery in Our Lord's Life and that of his Blessed Mother. It is the custom to recite five decades at a time while meditating on one set of mysteries.
