PRINCIPAL'S COMMENT

Hui Reflection

Thank you to all those parents that were able to attend the Hui on Monday night – even in atrocious weather! A big thank you to the P.F.G. who cooked sausages and prepared nibbles and hot drinks. The main Hui Topics were about future leadership, communication and future focuses.

In short; the BOT is currently starting the process of looking for a Principal to start in Term 1 (2016) and at the Hui, parents gave suggestions on what attributes they would like the future leader to have. If you have any suggestions please email them to me (by Friday 24th September) and I will ensure the Board receives them. The Board identified the importance of getting the right person and ensuring they take their time. The Board is being supported by the Catholic Education Office throughout this process. We also discussed "communication" and the need for the school to have and maintain effective communication with parents, whanau and the wider community. To date we have an updated website (which we are getting positive feedback on) and early in Term 4 will launch a phone app to support this process. It was noted that communication had improved in Term 3 but the school still needed to

make an effort to ensure everyone knows what is happening. A large part of effective communication is ensuring everyone is working towards the same vision. Meetings will be held in Term 4 to give parents a say in this.

As Acting Principal I shared my thoughts on the current strengths of the school; dedicated teachers and support staff, great kids, supportive parents, modern teaching practises to name a few. I also indicated the need to focus on building our IT capability to support learning as well as developing student agency (voice) in learning.

Our school is being supported through all of this by the Catholic Education Board, Ministry of Education, Education Review Office and NZ School Trustees Association.

We know that we can definitely make a positive difference to our children's learning and are determined to do so.
