SCIENCE CLUB REPORT AND IDEAS FOR HOME SCIENCE

So far we've investigated spinning seeds and had a go at making our own out of cardboard and blue tac, cut paper to make helicopter spinners, run the ink from water based felts up paper towels to look at the pigments, mixed and added water to food colours to see how many different colours we can make, made a variety of paper planes to compare their flight capabilities, blown air across the top of straws to make a sprayer, cut up a nappy to get the absorbent bits and added water to make a glop, grown a crystal, and changed the colour of daffodils. While thoroughly enjoying the easy to follow 5-10 minute videos the club coordinator uses to learn what to do each week I am finding due to sports etc. the children are struggling to make the 4:05pm Friday time, which save for weekends and evenings (all would require a staff member to attend) is the only time I have free. If a mum or dad is out there who is able to come in for one lunch time a week and run the club I think this will work much better and make it available to more than the 1 or 2 children currently able to make it each week. I will be available to answer questions in the unlikely event you need help with anything. (It really is that easy and clearly set out). If you can help please let Craig know and he can get in touch with me and I can give you access to the videos and show you where to find everything.
